## **BOTSWANA BIRD LIST: CATEGORY B RARITIES**

BirdLife Botswana's Category B rarities list is intended to fill the gap between the Category A rarities list and common birds for which it is not practical to keep records. The Category A list comprises species for which there are ten or few records for Botswana. The Category B list comprises species, which, though uncommon, have more than ten records, and for which BirdLife Botswana wishes to receive more records in order to learn more about their status. Category B records do not need a description to substantiate the sighting.

The majority of species on the list occur sparsely over much of the country, often in numbers that vary from year to year. A few of the species on the list, such as Lesser Kestrel and Wattled Crane, are vulnerable or endangered either worldwide or in southern Africa; BirdLife Botswana would like to monitor the populations of these species. A few species are either localised residents for which the full extent of their ranges is not known, or are ones that undertake movements that are not clear.

BirdLife Botswana wishes to receive records of all species on the following list. It is important that when records are submitted that details of numbers seen, as well as location and date(s) should be included. Records will be accredited with the observers' names.

The last Category B list appeared in *Babbler* 40 (Brewster, C.A. pp 57-58). The list below updates that one. In addition to the species that have been removed from Category A to Category B, a number of other species have been added to the list, namely European Roller, *Coracias garrulous*, Kori Bustard, *Ardeotis kori*, Bateleur, *Terathopius ecaudatus* and Martial Eagle, *Polemaetus bellicosus*. These four species are all species of conservation concern.

Some species have been removed from the list, namely Giant Kingfisher, *Megaceryle maxima*, Montagu's Harrier, *Circus pygargus*, Great Crested Grebe, *Podiceps cristatus*, Southern Boubou, *Laniarius ferrugineus*, Common Mynah *Acridotheres tristis*, Long-tailed Widowbird, *Euplectes progne*, Bronze Mannikin, *Lonchura cucullata* and Yellow Wagtail, *Motacilla flava*. The few records of Giant Kingfisher, Long-tailed Widowbird, Bronze Mannikin and Yellow Wagtail received concur with their known range in Botswana. Montagu's Harrier has been shown to be a locally fairly common migrant migrant, particularly in the northern Kalahari and Makgadikgadi Pans. Great Crested Grebe and Southern Boubou have been both shown to be fairly common in southeastern Botswana. Both the range and numbers of Common Mynah have expanded greatly in the past six years and it is now a common bird in Gaborone and in towns and larger villages in southeastern Botswana. While Common Mynah has been removed from the category B list any records of this species colonising areas of Botswana where it was previously unrecorded are of interest.
